The lead-in course is intended for teachers planning their onsite coaching course, and also for teachers interested in finding out about Finnish education system & learning from their own success practices.



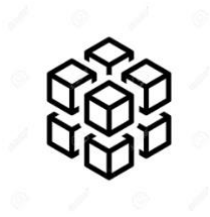
This course will:

- Support your reflection on personal **SUCCESS** during spring teaching
- Accelerate learning with peer learning on the **CHALLENGES** of the this academic year
- **TRANSFORM** your teaching in multicultural context, choosing on what you want to take away from Finnish school examples & other EU examples



What can you expect to get at the end:

- grounding the course (expectation, meeting participants and building up group intentions)
- practice observing skills and use instruments for own teaching activity reflection (and success) you can bring to onsite **COURSE** further in the future
- encounter & reflect on the impact of those with Finnish teachers, Finnish classroom & learning ways and also other European perspectives
- collectively create the ideas for projects, further work (participants corners & circle of practices)
